Applications are invited for a Residency in Equine Internal Medicine and Internship in Equine Practice.

For the residency we seek a veterinary surgeon, ideally with at least 2 years post-graduate equine experience, which may include a suitable internship. The resident will study towards a taught Masters in Veterinary Medicine and the European Diploma in Equine Internal Medicine. The primary focus of clinical activity will be equine medicine cases, however the resident will be expected to be involved in the care of all types of equine cases presented to the equine centre.

For the internship we are seeking a veterinary graduate with an enthusiasm for equine medicine and surgery. This internship provides training in soft tissue surgery, sports medicine, orthopaedics, internal medicine, emergency medicine, anaesthesia and diagnostic imaging. Your primary role will be working with our multidisciplinary team of specialists and assisting in provision of the equine referral service, including out-of-hours care of in-patients. Experience in clinical practice is desired but not essential
