

## **CLINICAL- OR TENURE-TRACK ASSISTANT/ASSOCIATE/FULL PROFESSOR OF EQUINE INTERNAL MEDICINE**

The Department of Clinical Sciences at the Auburn University College of Veterinary Medicine is seeking applicants to fill a full-time, 12-month appointment. Depending on experience, qualifications and interest, the successful candidate will be appointed to either a tenure-track (Assistant/Associate/Full Professor) or non-tenure track (Clinical Assistant/Associate/Full Professor) position in Equine Internal Medicine.

**Requirements/Qualifications:** The qualified applicant must hold a DVM or equivalent degree, have completed, or be enrolled in, residency training in the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine in the specialty of Large Animal Internal Medicine (ACVIM-LA) or the European College of Equine Internal Medicine (ECEIM), and either be a Diplomate of the ACVIM or ECEIM, or be qualified to sit for the ACVIM or ECEIM specialty examination. These qualifications must be met at the time employment begins. For a tenure-track position, research experience is desired. The candidate selected for this position must be able to meet eligibility requirements to work in the United States at the time the appointment is scheduled to begin and continue working legally for the proposed term of employment. Excellent communication skills are required in small group as well as large lecture hall settings. Eligibility for faculty veterinary licensure in the State of Alabama is also required.

**Responsibilities:** The successful candidate will be expected to participate in teaching and clinical service. Teaching responsibilities include the clinical and didactic instructional activities of the professional veterinary medicine and postgraduate training programs related to equine internal medicine. Clinical service and research responsibilities are negotiable and will depend on the successful candidate's interests and the type of appointment, i.e., clinical vs. tenure track. Ample opportunity exists to participate in established research programs on campus.

**Description of Equine Internal Medicine Service:** Auburn University College of Veterinary Medicine is home to the John Thomas Vaughan Large Animal Teaching Hospital which was completed in 2003. The equine clinic consists of two in-patient wards (containing air-conditioned and specially designed stalls for neurological or laminitic patients), a self-contained isolation complex, an out-patient/lameness diagnostic complex, an ICU, two large treatment/diagnostic areas, an endoscopy/standing surgical suite, nuclear scintigraphy, complete large animal digital radiological services, centralized pharmacy services, 3 surgical suites with 4 recovery boxes, and house officer/faculty offices and conference areas. Additional services on-site include equine 3T MRI, 64-slice CT, standing CT, and radiation therapy (Varian Edge™ linear accelerator). The JTV Large Animal Teaching Hospital is additionally outfitted with equipment for laparoscopy, digital video endoscopy (traditional and over-ground dynamic), laser surgery, ultrasonography, ECG/blood pressure/pulse oximetry, arthroscopy, critical care monitoring, dentistry, and TVEC. The successful candidate would join the team of 11 board-certified large animal internal medicine specialists (ACVIM-LA diplomates) at the College, 4 of which directly support the Equine Internal Medicine service. The additional diplomates support the Farm Animal Hospital service, Equine Ambulatory service, Anesthesia, and CVM administration. The Equine Internal Medicine service is also supported by services in

Equine Ophthalmology, Equine Sports Medicine and Surgery, Cardiology, Equine Diagnostic Imaging, and Neurology. There is a dedicated Equine Internal Medicine service technician that assists with daily operations and patient care. The equine internal medicine caseload includes first-opinion and referral cases.

**Application Process:** Applications must include 1) a letter of intent stating professional goals while in this position, 2) a current *curriculum vitae*, and 3) the names and email addresses of three professional references.
